an ice-skating jump in which the skater leaps from the back inside edge of one skate, making one full rotation of the body in the air, and lands on the back outside edge of the other skate.

**Skate Trivia:** Did you know that Swedish skater Ulrich Salchow invented the jump that bears his name in 1909? Theresa Weld of the US was the first female skater to perform a Salchow in competition at the 1920 Summer Olympics. She was told it was "unladylike" for her to do so, but she kept doing it anyway!
